The manufacturers guarantee is void because the replacement burner was not of the same brand. Three estimates have been obtained (copies enclosed). This transfer will enable us to replace the burned out unit. However, the Council should be aware that we will request another \$1,200 in next year's budget to install a fuel pump with service tank for the overhead furnace. This pump will greatly reduce maintenance and breakdown problems experienced with the present furnace. We will not be able to install the pump at this time due to insufficient funds.
