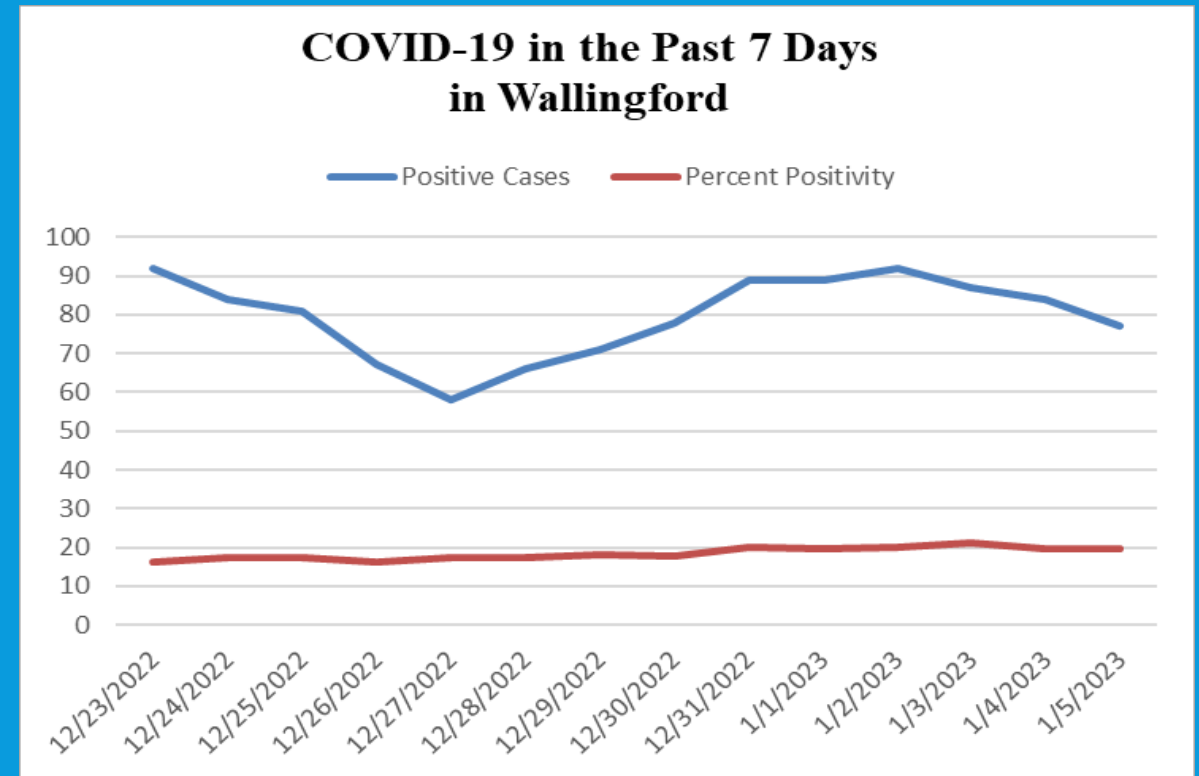
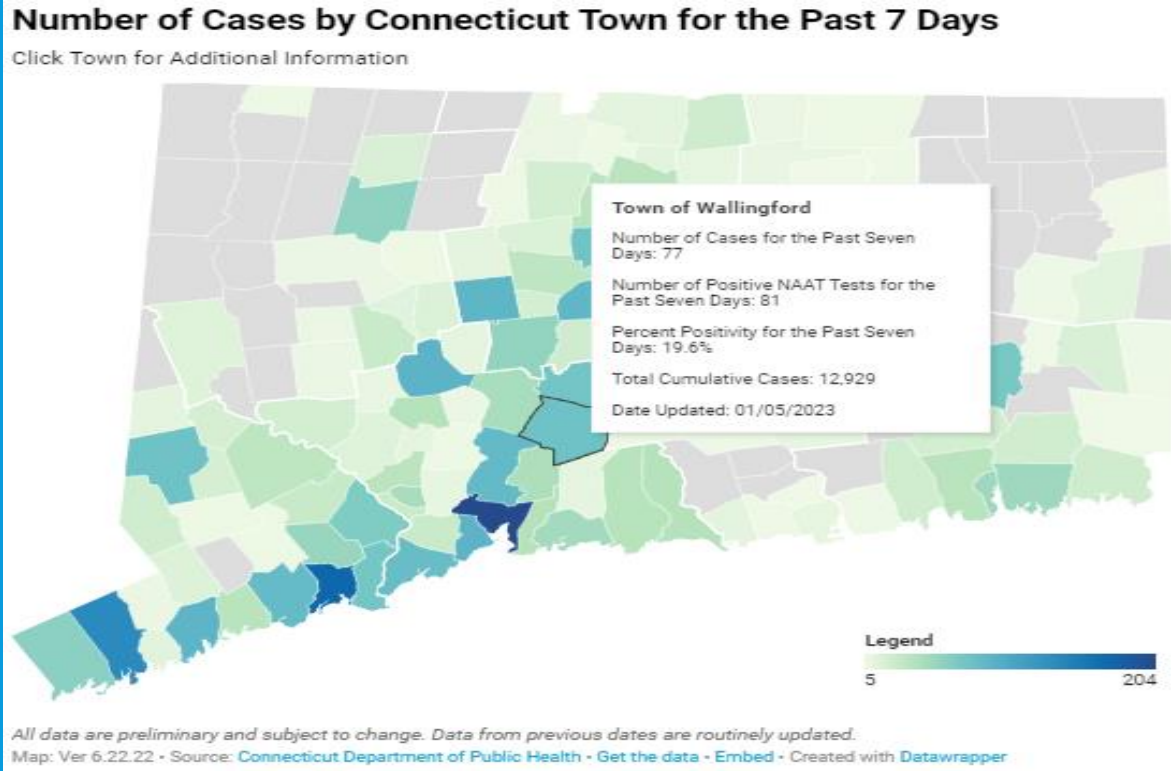

WEEKLY CONFIRMED CASE TOTALS

As of January 5th, 2023, in Wallingford, for the past 7 days, there were 77 confirmed cases of COVID-19, and the percent positivity (NAAT) for the past 7 days is 19.6%.

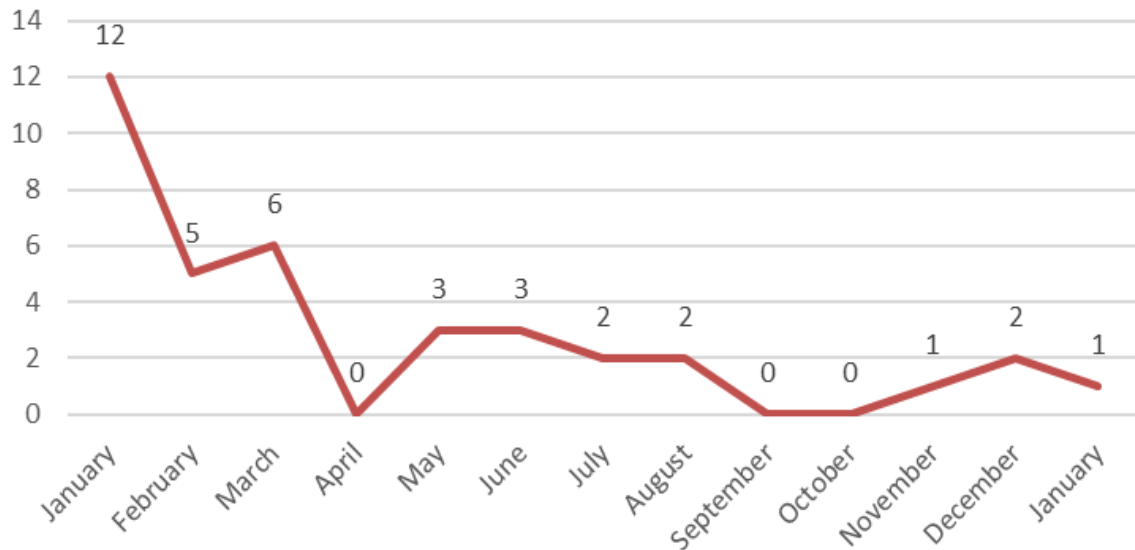




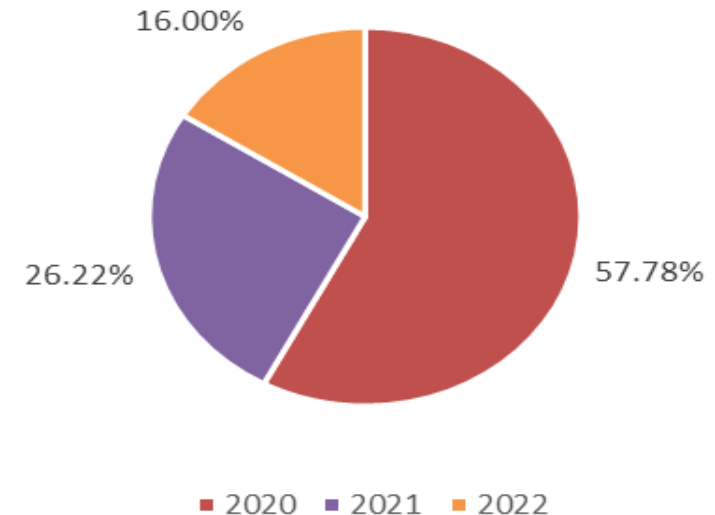
COVID-19 DEATHS IN WALLINGFORD

As of January 5th, 2023, Wallingford has recorded 226 fatalities due to COVID-19 since March 3rd, 2020. In 2022, a total of 36 fatalities were recorded. In 2021, 59, and in 2020, 130. Last fatality due to COVID-19 was on January 4th, 2023.

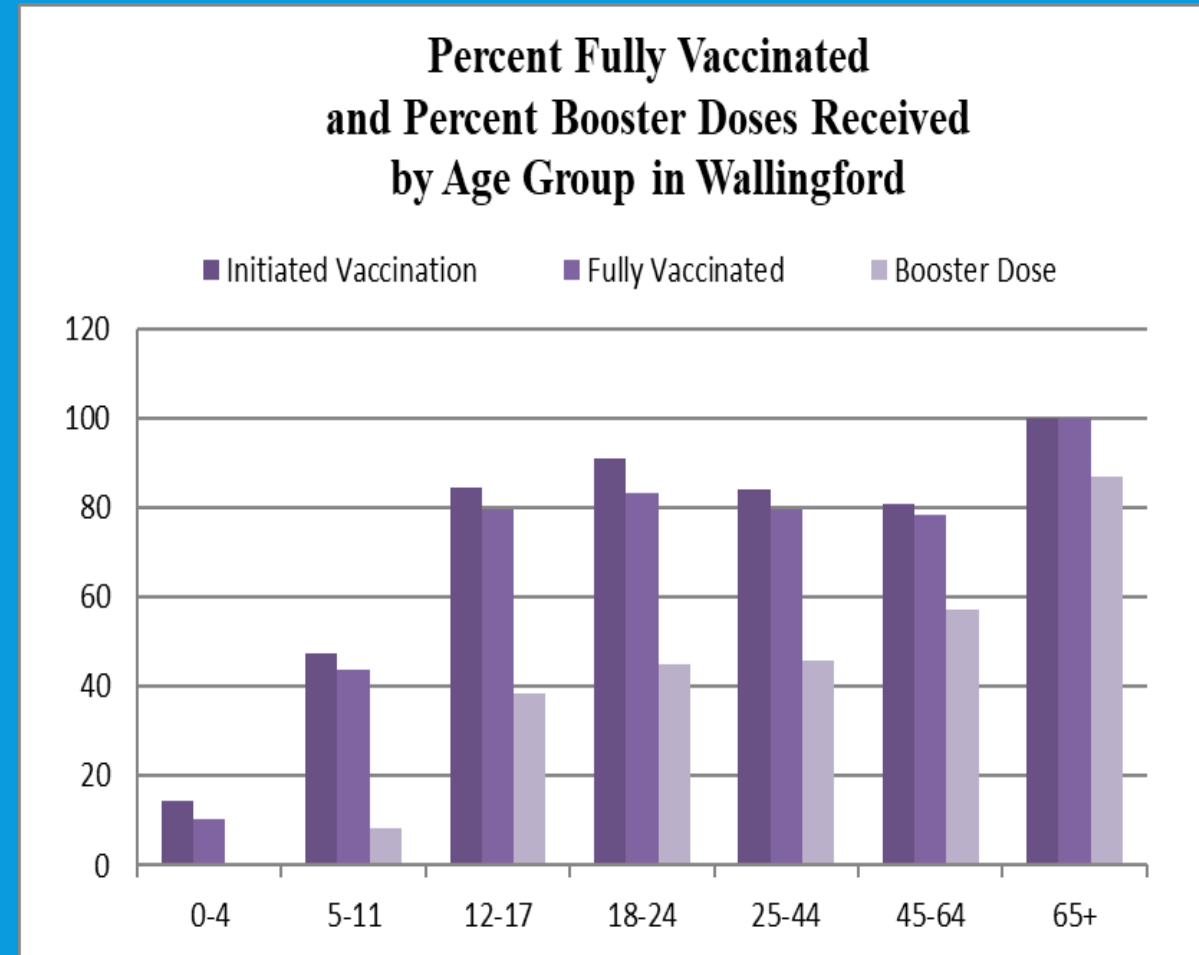




COVID-19 VACCINATIONS IN WALLINGFORD

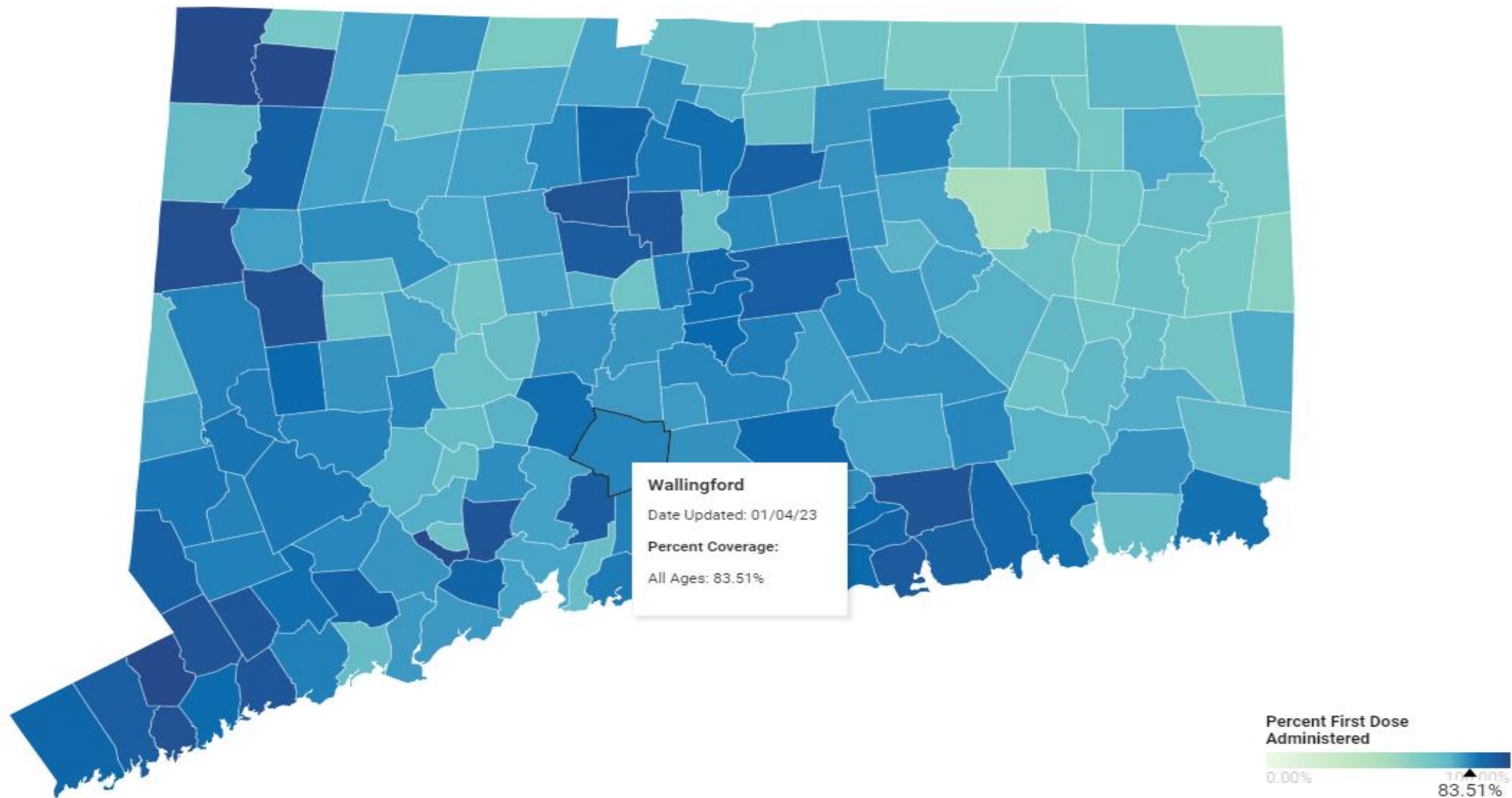
As of January 4th, 2023, 79.33% of Wallingford residents are fully vaccinated, 65.55% are up to date with COVID-19 vaccines, 52.00% have received a booster dose, and 83.51% have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

The age group with the highest percent of fully vaccinated individuals is 65 and older (100%), followed by 18-24 (83.34%), 12-17 (79.68%), 25-44 (79.44%), 45-64 (78.14%), 5-11 (43.93%), and 0-4 (10.4%).

COVID-19 HOSPITALIZATIONS AT WALLINGFORD HOSPITALS

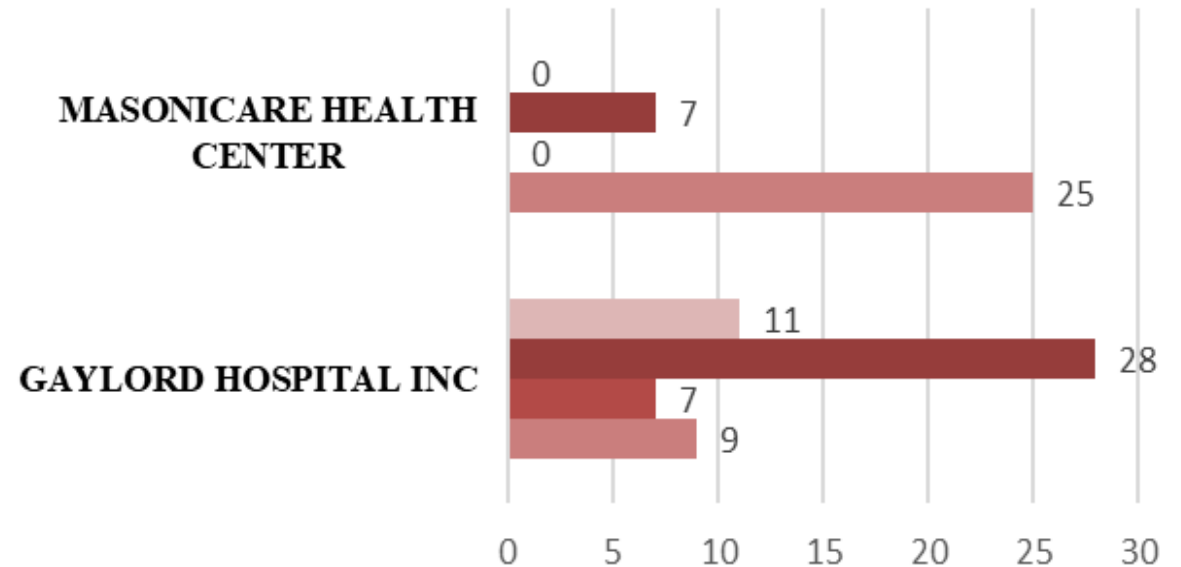
During the week of December 23rd to December 29th, 2022:

COVID-19 AT SCHOOLS IN WALLINGFORD

Academic Year 2022 – 2023

Number of students* and staff** who tested positive for COVID-19 from the period of 12/29/2022 to 01/04/2023. The reporting period is from Thursday to Wednesday.

If school name is not in the table, then no cases were reported.

If a school reported 1-5 cases, <6 is displayed. If 6 or more cases were reported, the exact number is displayed. In order to ensure confidentiality, data are suppressed for all schools reporting 1-5 cases for a particular reporting period.

The data does not show where the student or staff got infected.

*A student is any student enrolled at the school, regardless of which town they live in.

**Staff are employees or contractors that work at the school, such as teachers, custodial staff, clerical, bus transport, food service, administrators. They may or may not work directly with students. Administrative staff that work in a central district office who do not spend time in any school buildings are not included.

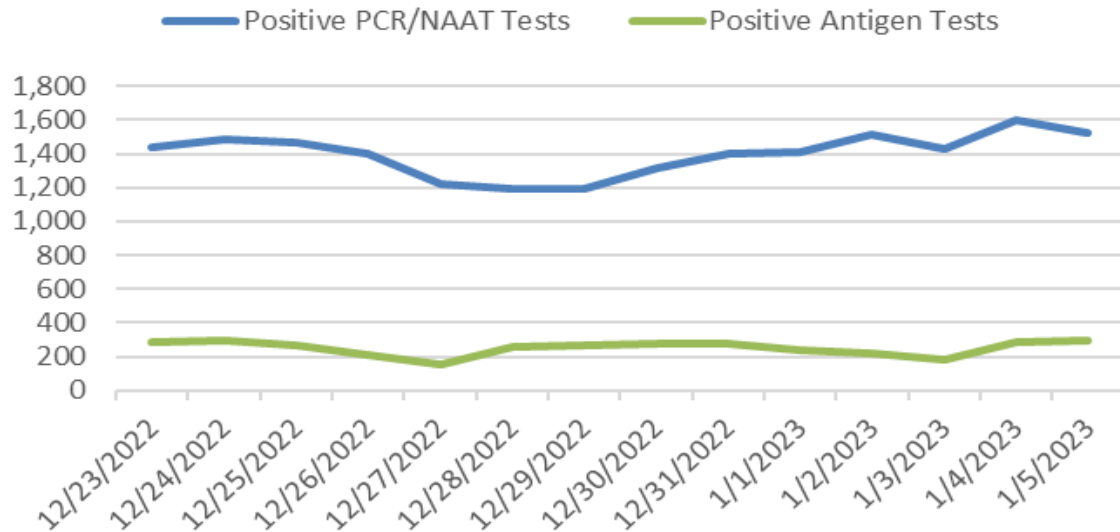

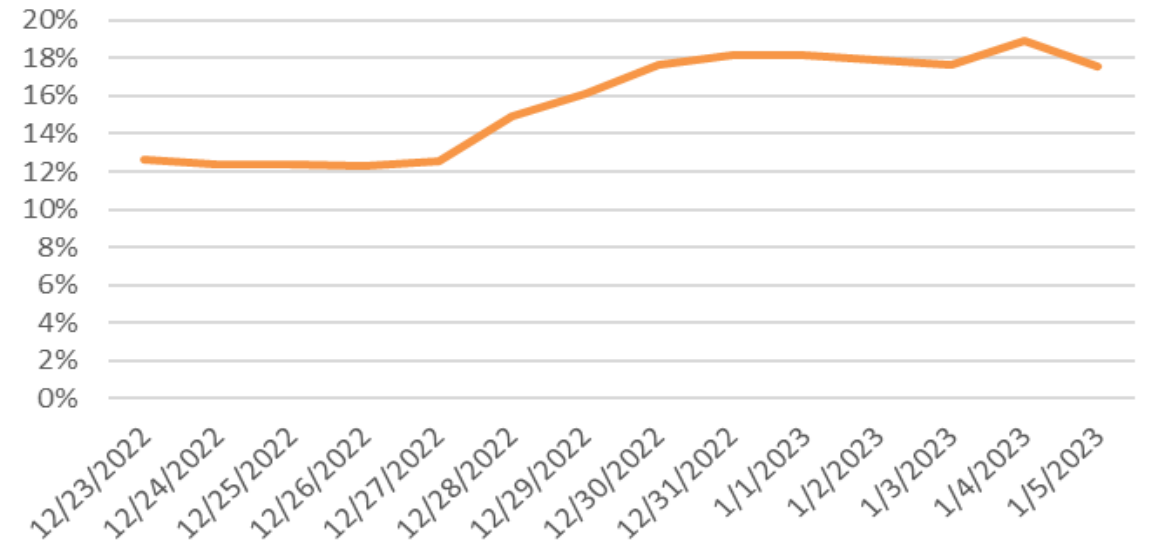
COVID-19 CASES IN NEW HAVEN COUNTY

As of January 5th, 2023, in the past 7 days:
New Haven County had 1,527 positive PCR/NAAT tests, and 300 positive antigen tests.
The percent positivity for New Haven County is 17.57%.

Percent Positivity of NAAT Tests in the Last 7 Days





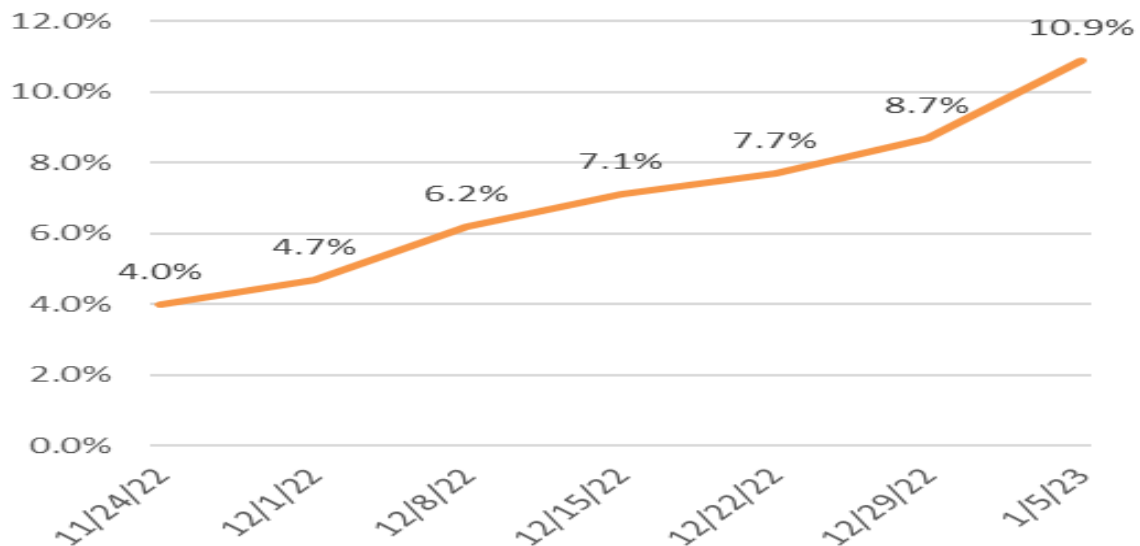
COMMUNITY LEVEL NEW HAVEN COUNTY

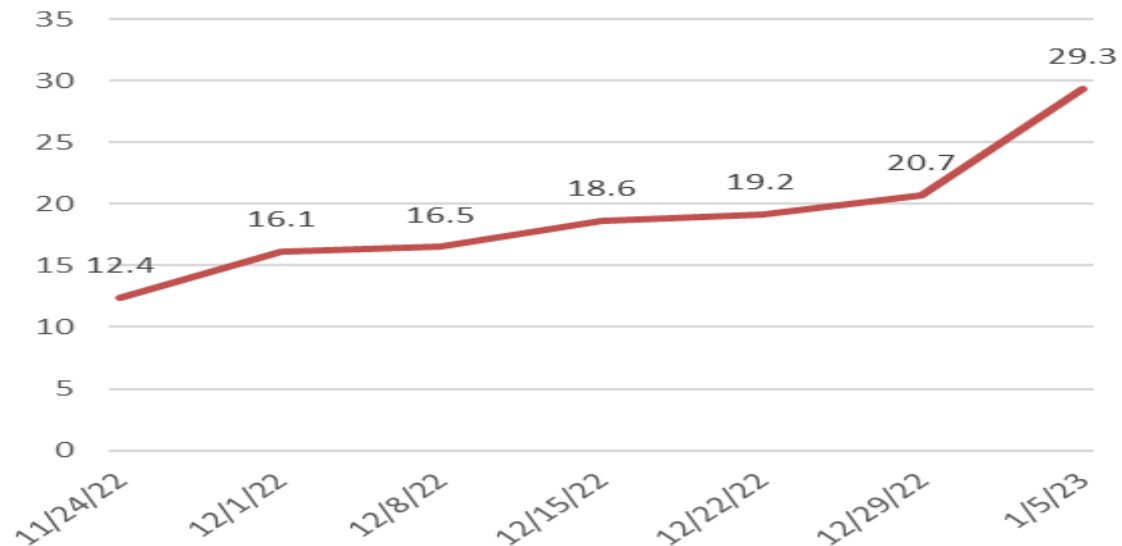
As of January 5th, 2023, CT Community Level of New Haven County is **High**.

COVID-19 IN CONNECTICUT

According to [Connecticut Department of Public Health \(CT DPH\)](#), as of January 4th, 2023, the total of laboratory-confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases reported among Connecticut residents is 953,006; 4,275 have been reported in the past 7 days. Seven hundred sixty-one patients are currently hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed COVID-19; of these, 259 (34.03%) are not fully vaccinated. The percent positivity in Connecticut is 17.36%.

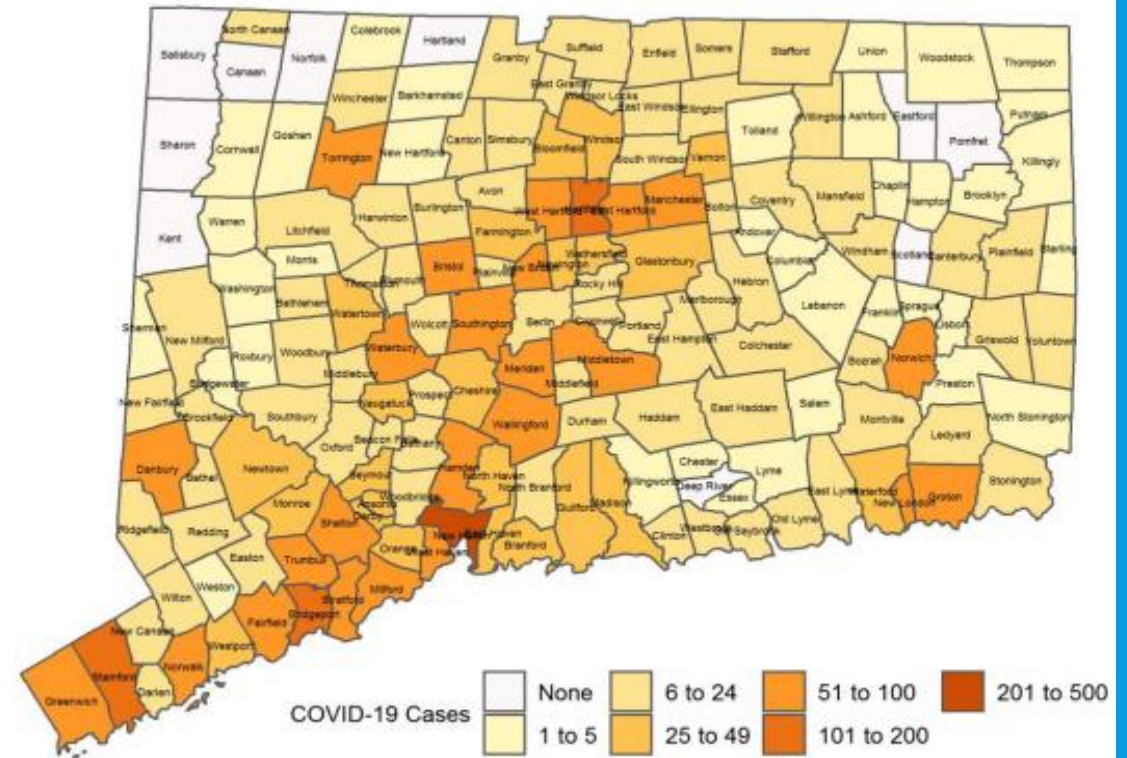


COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION OF COVID-19 IN CT

There were 4,275 new COVID-19 cases with specimen collection date during December 29 - January 04, as shown in the map.

During this seven-day period:
The statewide case rate was 118.554 per 100,000 CT population;
There were more than 100 new COVID-19 cases in 4 towns.

PATIENTS CURRENTLY HOSPITALIZED DUE TO COVID-19 BY CT COUNTY

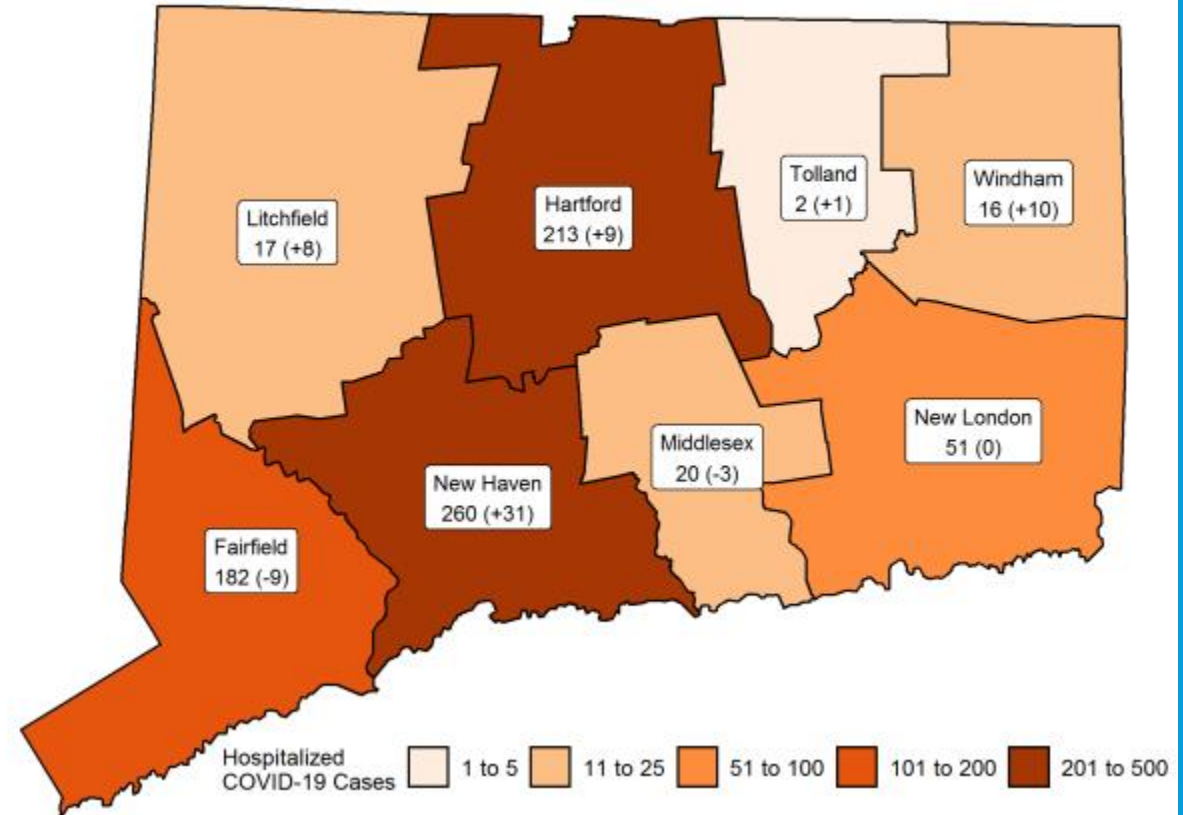
Hospitalization Surveillance

Distribution by location of hospital not patient residence. Data from the Connecticut Hospital Association.

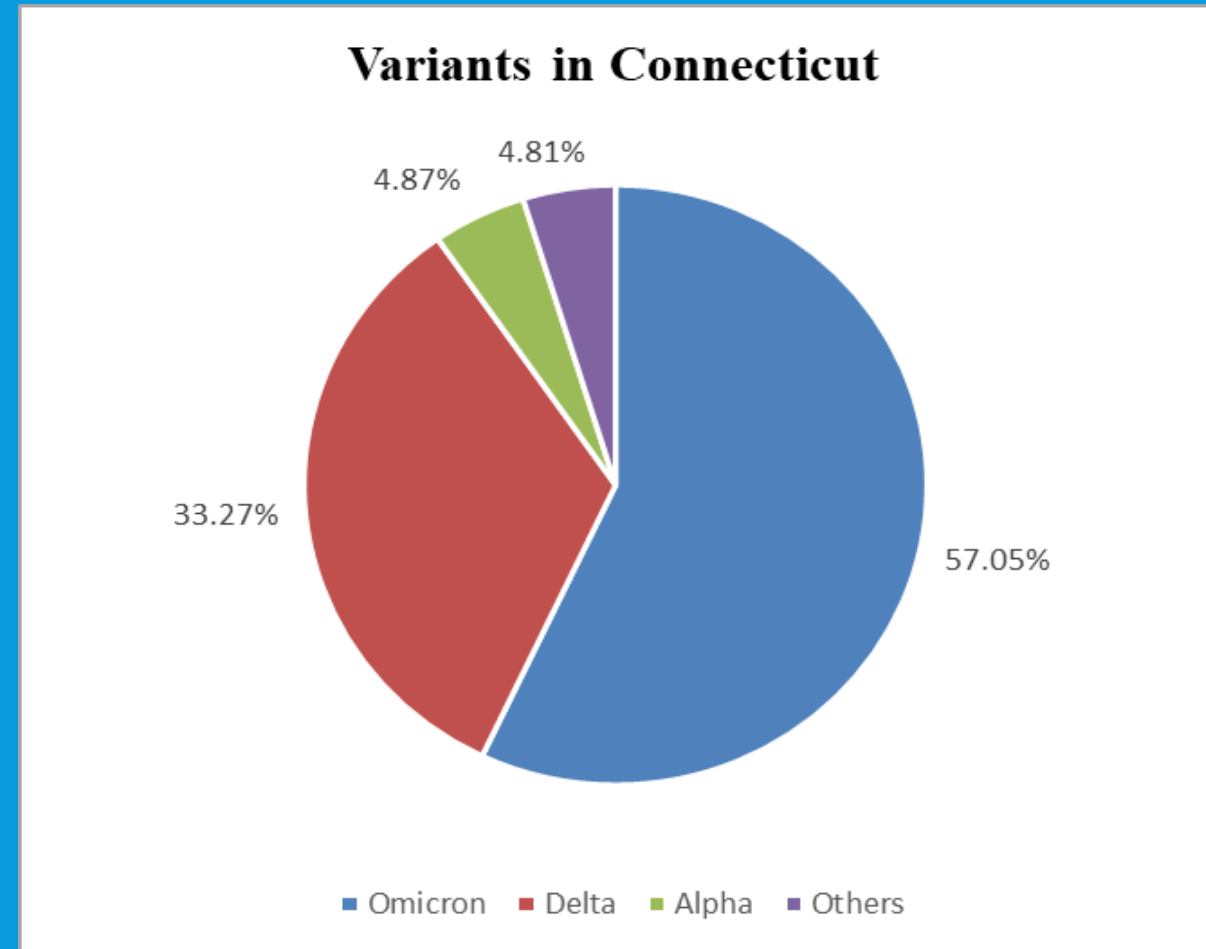




COVID-19 VARIANTS IN CONNECTICUT

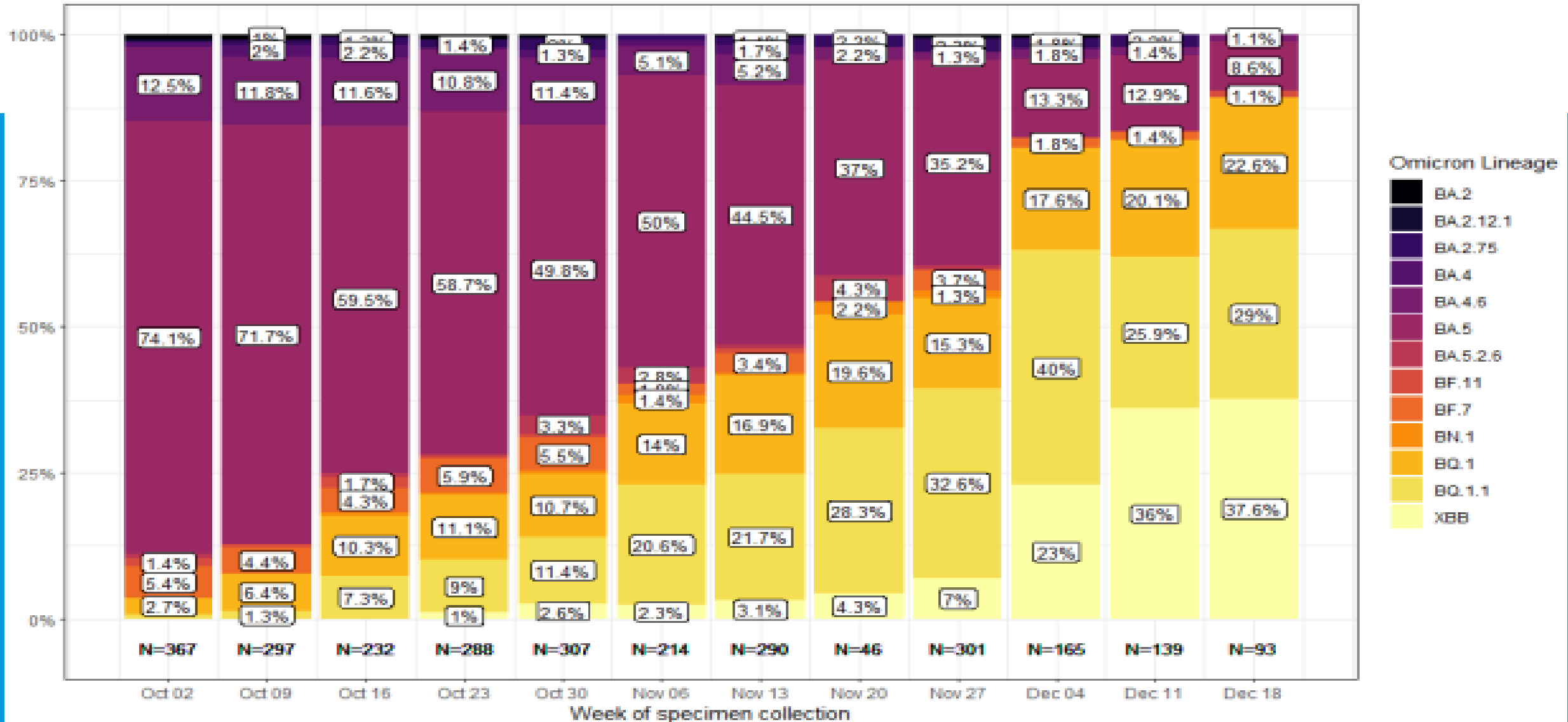
As of January 4th, 2023, 51,796 valid specimen of SARS-CoV-2 sequences were reported to CT DPH. Specimen collections were between 01/12/2021 and 12/23/2022. Omicron is considered a variant of concern, representing 57.05%, being followed by variants that are being monitored, Delta (33.27%), Alpha (4.87%), and others (4.81%).

As of December 18th, 2022, the omicron sub lineage of most concern is XBB, which represents 37.6% of the omicron specimen, followed by BQ.1.1 (29%), BQ.1 (22.6%), and BA.5 (8.6%).



- BA.2 includes BA.2 and all sublineages except BA.2.12.1, BA.2.75, BN.1, and XBB.
