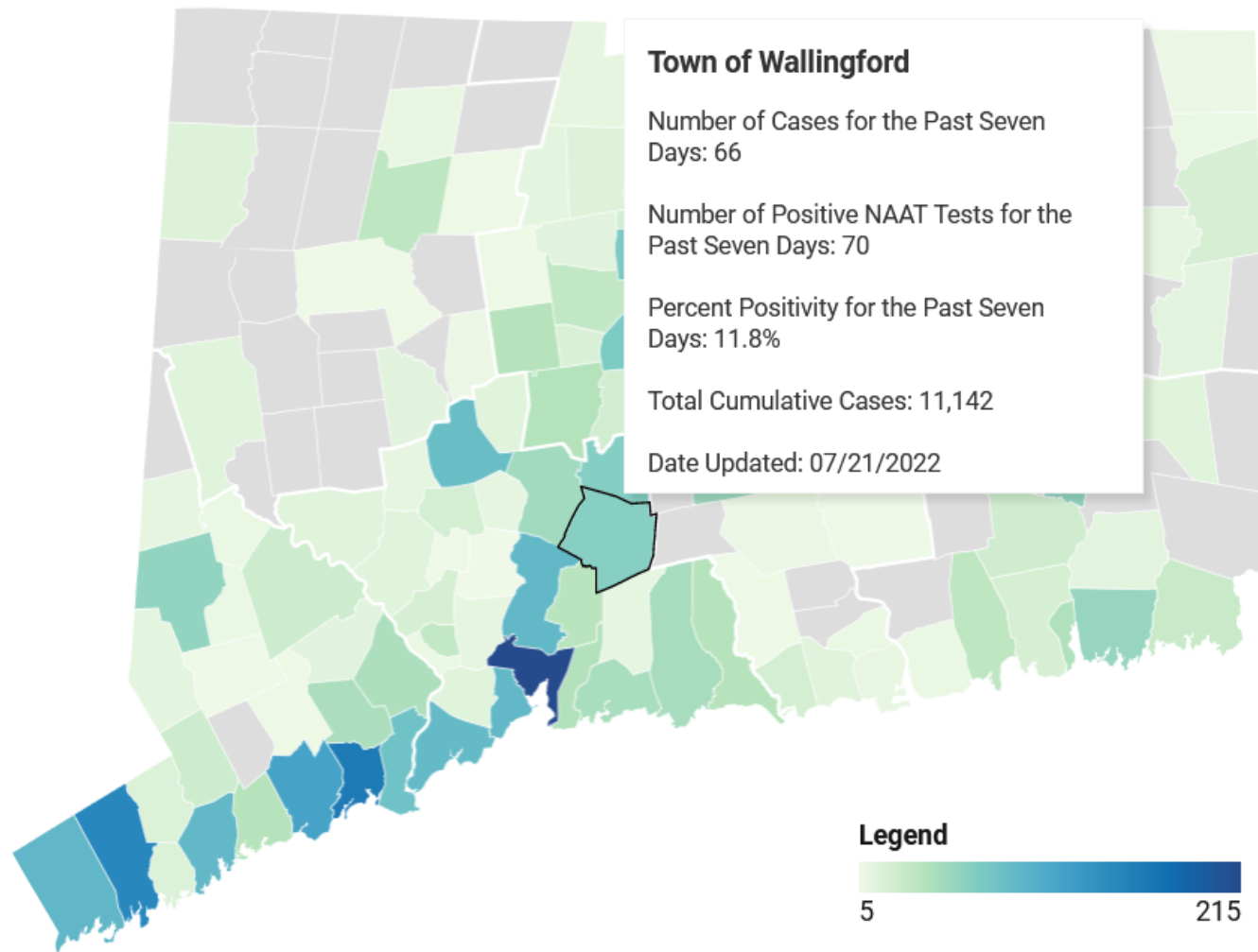

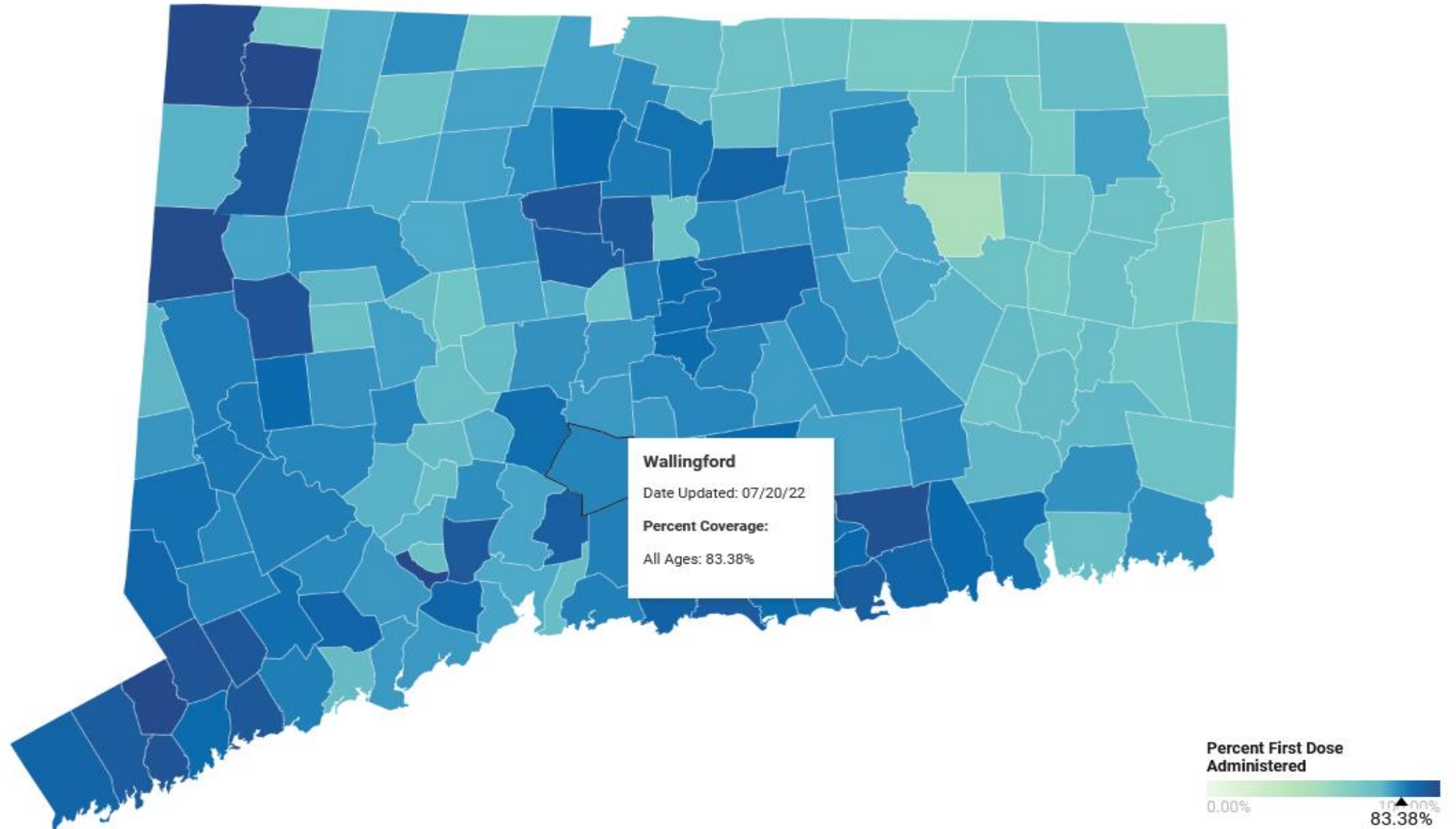


CT/WALLINGFORD DATA

- Hospitalizations Statewide - 312 as of (7/22/22)
- Positivity Rate Statewide – 10.59% as of (7/22/22)
- No Fatalities in CT Surveillance System recorded from Wallingford since June 22nd

VACCINATION STATISTICS- WALLINGFORD RESIDENTS (AGES 6 MONTHS+)

- 36,959 Residents received at least 1st dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine – **83.38%** of total population
- 34,728 Residents are fully vaccinated – **78.35%** of total population
- 22,294 Residents have received at least 1 booster dose – **50.3%** of total population
- 3,468,243 CT residents have received at least 1st dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine – **97.1%** of state's population

FDA APPROVAL

- As of August 23, 2021, the COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine was fully approved by the FDA.
- As of January 31, 2022, the COVID-19 Moderna vaccine was fully approved by the FDA.
- As of May 5, 2022, Johnson & Johnson (FDA has limited the use Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine. It has not yet received FDA's approval.

THIRD FULL DOSE

- CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP): recommends a third full dose of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine for immunocompromised individuals.
- The Connecticut Hospital Association (CHA) is working with DPH and state medical providers on the outreach to potential vaccine individuals.

BOOSTER SHOTS – HALF DOSE

- Who is eligible for a booster?
 - Everyone ages 5 years and older should get 1 booster after completing their COVID-19 primary series of vaccination.
- Who is eligible for 2 boosters?
 - Adults ages 50 years and older.
 - Some people ages 12 years and older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised.

TRAVEL ADVISORY

- Mandates and requirements regarding travel are no longer in effect in CT as of March 19, 2021.
 - Residents and visitors to CT are strongly urged to follow travel-related guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the CT Department of Public Health (CT DPH)
- Travelers should review CDC's travel guidance when planning travel outside of their local community.
- **Do not travel if** you are sick or are considered infectious after testing positive for Covid-19 or should be quarantining after exposure to a person with covid-19.

MASK MANDATES

- As of February 28, 2022, all statewide mask mandates have been lifted.
- It is recommended that those who are not fully vaccinated continue to wear a mask.
