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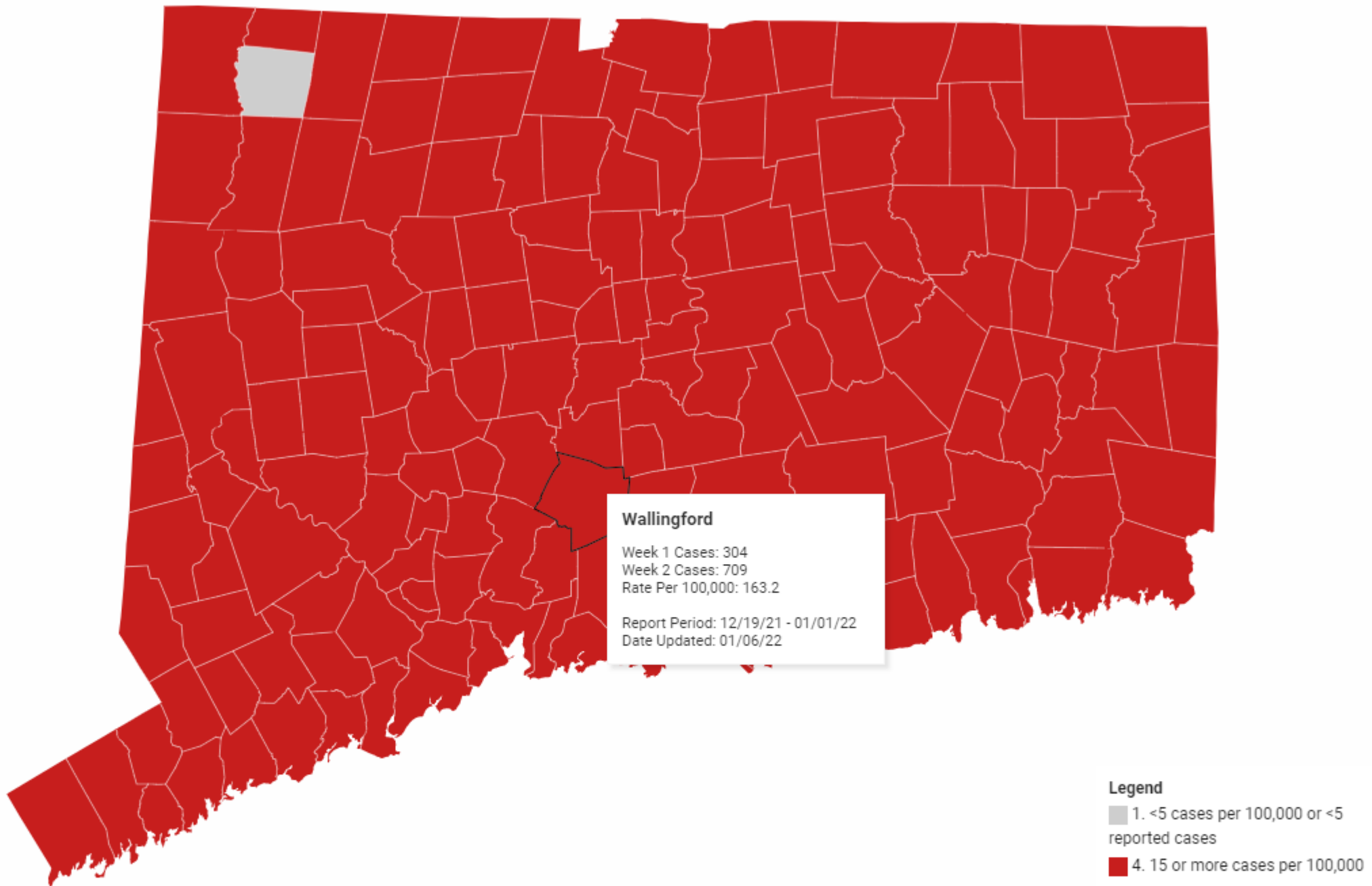

*This map shows the average daily rate of new cases of COVID-19 by town during the past two weeks. Only cases among persons living in community settings are included in this map; the map does not include cases among*

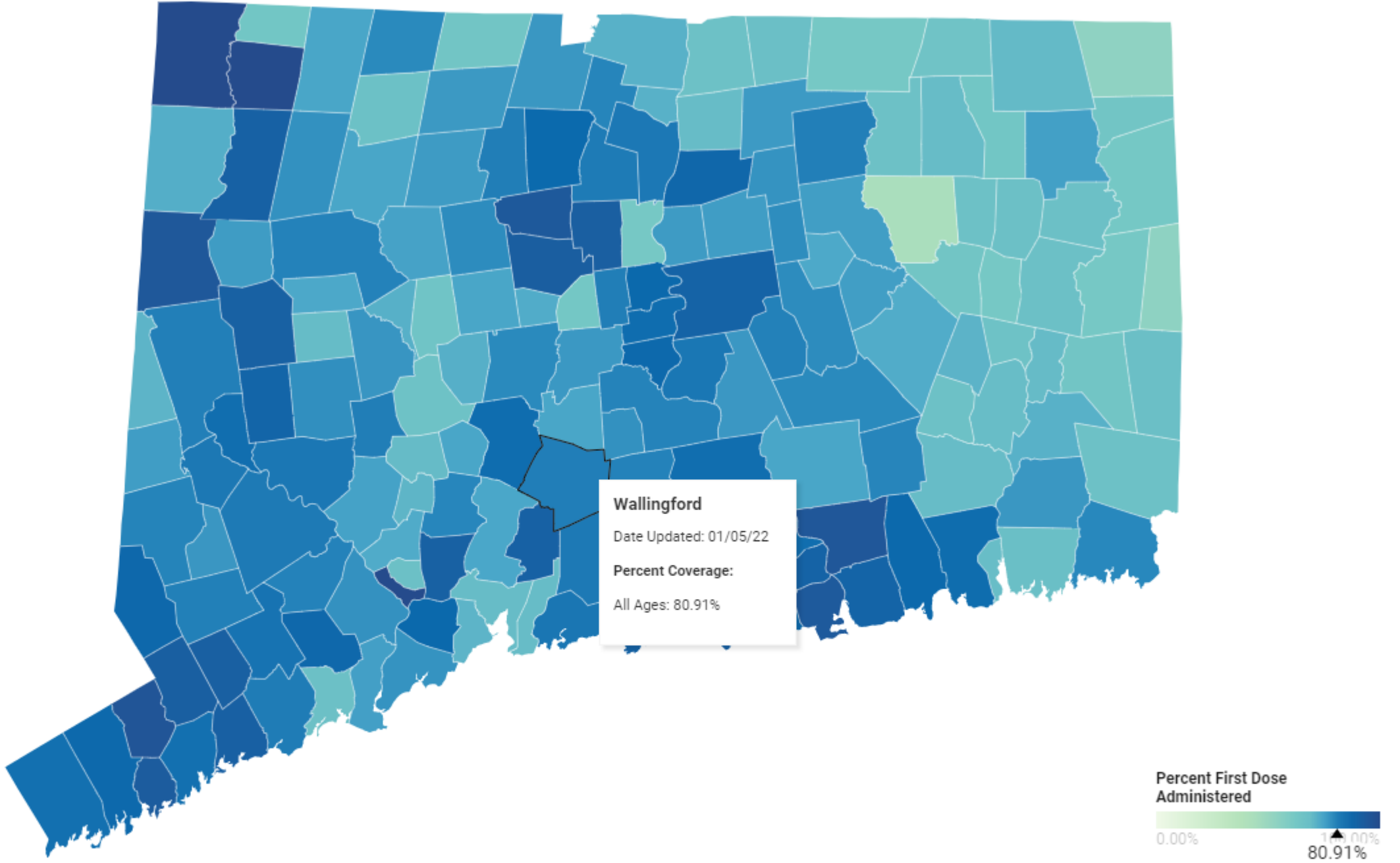

- 18-24 years old – 85.27% (2,917)
- 25-44 years old – 82.91% (9,085)
- 45-64 years old – 80.96% (11,297)
- 65+ years old – 100% (8,953)

is **563635** , including **504569** laboratory-confirmed and **59066** probable cases. **One thousand seven hundred eighty-four** patients are currently hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed COVID-19; of those **1213** ( 68 %) are not fully vaccinated. There have been **9281** COVID-19-associated deaths.

# UPCOMING CLINICS

The Town of Wallingford Health Department is hosting a series of walk-in (no appointment needed) Covid-19 booster vaccination clinics at the Wallingford Parks and Recreation Department located on 6 Fairfield Blvd. At this time, booster doses and initial doses will be available for those 18 and older. Moderna vaccine will be utilized throughout the series of clinics. An individual would be eligible for a booster dose starting 6 months after receiving their second dose of Moderna/Pfizer.
