Chairman Parisi convened the public hearing and stated that the \$2,268,000 2011-2012 CIP bond ordinance, which is the subject of this public hearing, and is available to the public and may be obtained at this meeting from the Town Clerk.

Councilor Farrell moved, and the motion was seconded by Councilor Rascati, to read the Title and Section one of the ordinance as proposed in its entirety and to waive the reading of the remainder of the ordinance, incorporating its full text into the minutes of this meeting.

Councilor Farrell read the Title and Section 1 of the Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,268,000 FOR THE PLANNING, ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS MUNICIPAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS 2011-2012 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$2,268,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE

Section 1. The sum of \$2,268,000 is appropriated for the planning, acquisition and construction of municipal capital improvements 2011-2012 consisting of: (i) Roadway Reconstruction – East Scard Road; (ii) Roadway Reconstruction North Plains Industrial Road, North Plains Highway to Route 68; (iii) Burke Heights and Wal Mart Bus Shelters; (iv) Roadway Reconstruction Northford Road Phase I; (v) North Branford Road Phase III, construction; (vi) Town wide sidewalk installation and replacement; (vii) Town wide storm culvert repair and replacement; (viii) Quinnipiac River Linear Trail, Phase IV- preliminary design study; (xi) Downtown parking improvements; (xii) South Turnpike road culvert; and for appurtenances, equipment and services related thereto, or so much thereof as may be accomplished within such appropriation, including administrative, advertising, printing, legal and financing costs to the extent paid therefrom, said appropriation to be in addition to all prior appropriations for said

purpose and inclusive of any and all State and Federal grants-in-aid, as set forth in the Capital Improvement Plan 2011-2012, as amended.

Chairman Parisi called for comments from the public. He asked three times, and there were no responses. At 7:06 PM., Chairman Parisi declared the Public Hearing adjourned.

"AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,268,000 FOR THE PLANNING, ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS MUNICIPAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS 2011-2012 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$2,268,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE'', a copy of which is attached hereto, be adopted.

A MOTION TO AMEND THE ORDINANCE WAS MADE TO DELETE as a project(viii) Quinnipiac River Linear Trail, Phase IV- preliminary design study.MADE BY:LETOURNEAUSECONDED BY:ECONOMOPOULOS

Council discussion questioned why bonding is necessary when we are going to use cash. Comptroller Bowes recounted that it gives the town flexibility, that it accounts for this statutorily as this has no lapsing and that it strengthens the funding in that these funds cannot be used for anything else.

It was reported that given the nature of the grants, the location of bus shelters could not be moved as the grant applications include the design location of the projects; that unspent money left in Cap & Non and can only be spent on Capital projects; cannot add to revenue to reduce taxes; could be used for another project. From the Public Section Lynn Hoffman, Co-Chairwoman, Quinnipiac River Linear Trail Advisory Committee, added that without the capital improvement funds the project cannot apply for other funds that are available and without the design from the study that they cannot approach property owners along the river to discuss property easements as the relate to the project design; discussion with regard to a project on Engineering Line 1025; that the vote is on the funding ordinance; that the specific projects to be accomplished by it are part of the budget and would be voted on as part of the budget, the Capital and Non-Recurring Fund; the ordinance does not specify which project; it only specifies the amount of money; the vote on the budget would specify which project is being funded.

Attorney Fasi, Bond Counsel, reported that the ordinance refers to the Capital Improvement Plan as it is adopted, so the Capital Improvement Plan 2011-2012 as it is adopted, and subsequently amended, if at all, are the projects that are funded. Mayor Dickinson stated that the Capital Improvement Plan, as adopted under the Six-Year Capital, is part of the budget vote and is where the change would occur with regard to the specific projects. The ordinance allows for the level of spending, and then the projects that we would be adopting are part of the budget. Attorney Fasi responded to Councilor Testa that projects can be amended during the year, that the ordinance lists the projects for the existing plan, but as the Capital Improvement Plan is changed, then the projects that are funded can change. The ordinance language says the Capital Improvement Plan "as amended". If a project is taken out, the funds can be assigned to another project. The Mayor stated that if you don't want to do a project that is listed, then you can take it out of the ordinance now, so there is no doubt and leave the funds in place, and later put in a new project. It would also need to be taken out of the Capital Improvement Plan as well. Attorney Fasi said that you list the projects as this is a Capital

Improvement Program bond ordinance and that there are programs in the Capital Improvement proposed programs, so that is what's being funded. The projects are listed, and the program is referenced. If the project is eliminated from the ordinance, it doesn't mean the project is gone from the Capital Improvement Plan, and if there is other funding in the Capital Improvement Plan, then the project is still alive. That's what this amendment is – the project is deleted but the money is still there. It's like any capital project. There was still some confusion, and it was asked if this project removal, or any other project, would have an effect on the taxpayer. Mayor Dickinson stated the Capital & Non-Recurring Fund is not funded by tax payer dollars, and there is no impact on the mill rate, and it won't influence the electric rates or tax rates. The electric division is obligated to pay to the town a payment in lieu of taxes.

Councilor Sullivan addressed the paramedic situation in the town and stated the he supports the return of funding to the Fire Department for paramedics coverage on nights and weekends. He spoke passionately about never debating the health and welfare of our citizens.

A long discussion ensued with regard to the need of paramedics nights and weekends, accompanied by many, many stories of the fine service provided to the citizens by the Fire Department at critical

moments in people's lives; drawing the line; uncollectible billings in the Fire Department; depletion of the reserve account and increase in future taxes; that there is no financial reason to defeat the motion; that we have backup services; that we need to maintain our reserves and bond rating, and our ability to borrow; concern for the Police Department being down three officers; discussion with regard to state funding and its final picture and effect on the town and on the educational budget; Mayor Dickinson stated that there is one paramedic on the nights and weekends; request for and questions with regard to departmental efficiency studies; the request for commissions in certain departments as an overseer. Councilor Farrell stated that while he supports the motion, he would like to wait and see where the state budget lands and then to revisit this issue in the future. Geno Zandri, Robert Gross and Ray Ross made brief statements. Ambulance rates were discussed with regard to state rate setting and reasonable and customary charges..
